

### ANA ESTEVE LLORENS

Ana Esteve Llorens (Valencia, 1975) arrived in the United States thanks to a Fulbright scholarship and obtained an MFA in Sculpture and Extended Media from VCU (Virginia Commonwealth University). She has been awarded numerous awards and scholarships, including the AMEXCID Excellence Award and the Art and Law Foundation Scholarship. She has been an artist-in-residence at Yaddo in New York, the French Academy in Madrid, and the National Institute of Fine Arts in Mexico City, among others.

She lives between Austin (Texas) and Valencia (Spain).

Ana Esteve Llorens' work includes installation, sculpture and photographs created in reference to the space they occupy and the human body. Through the reinterpretation of existing forms, the artist proposes an inquiry into the nature and understanding of time, challenging its consumption and offering material spaces that relate personal and collective stories.

Research of materials often linked to distant times and geographies play a crucial role in her projects. Revising ancient artisanal techniques and interlacing them with sculptural processes, Esteve Llorens composes works that defy the formal and conceptual notions of origin and belonging, contrasting nature with culture.

In 2015 the artist started to work with yarns and weaving techniques she had encountered when living and traveling throughout Mexico, combining them with those of her native Spain. Since then, she has continued to research the sculptural possibilities of fibers. Her works expand on the expressive and spatial potential of textiles, taking the intimacy of what is hand-crafted to a sculptural scale. Pliable planes claim and take space and are granted three-dimensionality.

Weaving becomes an active way of thinking. Aware of the ouvre of key figures in the history of art and design, such as Anni Albers, Florence Knoll, and Jackie Winsor, among others, and simultaneously creating with body and mind, the artist challenges the modern precepts that defined abstraction at the beginning of the XX century. A set of predefined rules and a projected geometric shape contrasts with an organic, flexible outcome.

The line-thread is taken as a fundamental compositional element in every work. Lines define directions that may be truncated, join points, divide surfaces, and offer multiple configurations in their shape and trajectory.

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The creation of this group of pieces comprises weaving on a backstrap loom, a traditional method of textile production that starts defining dimensions and densities of threads, that is, length and width of warp. These dimensions are equally determined by the space where the textiles are produced, by the different thicknesses of the fibers employed, and by the possibilities and limitations of the body of the artist, the weaver.

Colors are the result of an investigation of the history of natural dyes and an exploration of native and invasive plants, seeds, and insects growing in the surrounding places. Natural pigments are manually extracted by grinding and boiling substances. Colors, dependent on the conditions of the season, carry with them the memory of the places and of their elaboration: temperature, humidity, water quality. Each color is irrevocably unique, and present. Raw, gathered and found yarns, such as cotton, jute and hemp, are combined with naturally dyed cotton threads and set taut on a backstrap loom. Surfaces are slowly hand-woven showing and concealing warp and weft, growing into shapes as threads compress and expand along the duration of the process.

The resulting textiles are then carefully sewn onto fabric and stretched and mounted over foam-cushioned plywood. A custom-made frame underlines the final shapes.

Each piece becomes a place, with a density, a diary of moving lines, the record of a performance in time. Layers of time are juxtaposed on surfaces that claim space; the time of the materials, the time of the process and the real time of the viewer.

#### CHINGSUM JESSYE LUK

The work of Chingsum Jessye Luk (Hong Kong, 1982; lives and works in Zurich) addresses the limits of art and its relationship with the everyday; it is a meditation on the evolution of time, memory, perception and language. The artist collects small and insignificant objects from everyday life, and her interest lies in monotonous and repetitive gestures. Based on found objects, her work reflects an obsessive need to collect the everyday, to measure, count, accumulate, catalogue, inventory and modify it in a methodical, sometimes pseudoscientific way. Her work is a study of the cyclical and infinite nature of time, an exercise in discipline, a praise of the trivial, a tribute to boredom.

In 2019, Chingsum Jessye Luk was awarded the City of Zurich Art Fellowship.

Starting from used paper, loaded with memories and personal stories, Chingsum Jessye Luk recombines it in minimalist frameworks, redefining a technique traditionally and historically associated with the domestic sphere. The lattices of her braided papers transport us to the flow of daily life, while reclaiming the gender associations of textile art, closely linked to feminine work due to the sentimental importance attached to the material and the intimacy of the procedure.

In the "Potentially Seditious" series, Chingsum Jessye Luk explores the unstable border between writing and drawing, as well as its relationship with semantic and orthographic satiety, where repetition leads to the loss or breakdown of meaning. Her interest lies not in language as a communication tool, but rather in its potential for misinterpretation. Her concerns around writing do not arise from its linguistic level, but from its graphic or gestural component, from its abstract deconstruction into lines, patterns or shapes, resembling drawing. As a result of the illegibility, the meaning or content no longer matters, or perhaps it matters even more precisely because of it.

The artist delves into the issues of censorship, privacy and dissemination of informationm while making a deliberate effort to censor the texts, rendering them unreadable. The works are based on reconstructed slogans from the 2019 protest movement in Hong Kong. After Hong Kong's national security law was passed in 2020, certain slogans or words could be considered seditious and people who display or utter them in public could be arrested and prosecuted as a threat to national security..
